Background

The Snohomish County Health Services Careers Partnership (HSCP) was formed in 2003 to address the health care workforce shortages in Snohomish County, WA. The Partnership includes health care professionals, educational representatives, and other key stakeholders who seek to address health care workforce demands through:

- 1) Developing and maintaining private and public partnerships to respond to the health care industry work force needs
- 2) Increasing training capacity in high demand health occupations
- 3) Supporting recruitment and retention strategies within the health care industry
- 4) Attracting a diverse audience, including youth, into health occupations
- 5) Developing, maintaining, and communicating health career planning materials

- 1) Increase training capacity for high demand health occupations (2004 Priority: Nursing & Imaging)
- 2) Retain a greater number of health care professionals in high demand health occupations (2004 Priority: Nursing & Imaging)
